## The Western Pacific Courts Order 1967

At the Court at Windsor Castle, the 12th day of April 1967

Present,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Her Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of Her powers under the British Settlements Acts 1887 and 1945(a), the Pacific Islanders Protection Act 1875(b), and the Foreign Jurisdiction Act 1890(c), is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Western Pacific Courts Order 1967 and shall be construed as one with the Western Pacific (Courts) Orders 1961 and 1966(d).

Citation, construction and commencement.

(2) This Order and the Western Pacific (Courts) Orders 1961 and 1966 may be cited together as the Western Pacific Courts Orders 1961 to 1967.

(3) This Order shall come into operation on 19th April 1967.

2. Section 6(4) of the Western Pacific (Courts) Order in Council 1961 is amended by the insertion after the words "in office" of the words "without his consent".
