**The Betterment Levy (Waiver of Interest) (No. 2)
 (Amendment) Regulations 1968**

<i>Made</i>	31st January 1968
<i>Laid before the House of Commons</i>	8th February 1968
<i>Coming into Operation</i>	11th February 1968

The Minister of Housing and Local Government and the Secretary of State, acting jointly, being for the purposes of these regulations the appropriate Ministers in relation to Great Britain, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by sections 51(4) and 98 of the Land Commission Act 1967(a), and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following regulations:—

Citation, extent, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) These regulations, which may be cited as the Betterment Levy (Waiver of Interest) (No. 2) (Amendment) Regulations 1968, apply to Great Britain and shall come into operation on 11th February 1968.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(b) applies to the interpretation of these regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Amendment of the Betterment Levy (Waiver of Interest) (No. 2) Regulations 1967

2. In regulation 3 of the Betterment Levy (Waiver of Interest) (No. 2) Regulations 1967(c), the words "and is not proposed to be recovered by the Commission" shall be omitted.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

The Betterment Levy (Waiver of Interest) (No. 2) Regulations 1967 provide for the waiver of interest payable to the Commission on unpaid levy in certain cases, including cases (whether or not there has been any previous waiver by virtue of the said regulations or the Betterment Levy (Waiver of Interest) Regulations 1967) where the amount of such interest does not exceed £1 and is not proposed to be recovered by the Commission.

The regulations now made delete the words "and is not proposed to be recovered by the Commission", the waiver therefore now being for any amount not exceeding £1 without exception.

These regulations, like the previous regulations, apply to Great Britain.
