The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas it appears to Her Majesty that a decision of the Commission on Narcotic Drugs of the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations to alter Schedule I to the Single Convention on Narcotic Drugs signed at New York on 30th March 1961 so as to add the substance dihydrocodeinone O-carboxymethyloxime thereto requires the addition of that substance to Part I of the Schedule to the Dangerous Drugs Act 1965(a):

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred on Her by section 12 of the Dangerous Drugs Act 1965, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:---

1. In paragraph 1 in Part I of the Schedule to the Dangerous Drugs Act 1965 (which specifies substances dealings in which are subject to control under Part III of the Act) after the word "Dihydrocodeine" there shall be inserted the words "Dihydrocodeinone O-carboxymethyloxime".

2. This Order may be cited as the Dangerous Drugs Act 1965 (Modification) Order 1968 and shall come into operation on 1st November 1968.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order brings under control under Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act 1965 the substance dihydrocodeinone O-carboxymethyloxime, its salts and its esters and their salts, and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of any of those substances. The result of such control will be that it will not be lawful to import or export any of those substances except under licence, and that those substances will be subject to control under Part II of the Dangerous Drugs (No. 2) Regulations 1964 —S.I. 1964/1811.
