**The Fugitive Offenders (Bermuda) (Amendment)
Order 1968**

Present,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by sections 17 and 20 of the Fugitive Offenders Act 1967(a), is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Fugitive Offenders (Bermuda) (Amendment) Order 1968 and shall be construed as one with the Fugitive Offenders (Bermuda) Order 1967(b), as amended(c) (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Order”).

(2) The principal Order and this Order may be cited together as the Fugitive Offenders (Bermuda) Orders 1967 and 1968.

(3) This Order shall come into operation on 1st November 1968.

2. The Interpretation Act 1889(d) shall apply, with the necessary adaptations, for the purpose of interpreting this Order and otherwise in relation thereto as it applies for the purpose of interpreting, and in relation to, Acts of Parliament.

3. In section 13(1) of the Schedule to the principal Order the words “Colonial Secretary” are deleted and the words “Chief Secretary” are substituted.

 EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

The present constitution of Bermuda, which came into force on 8th June 1968, made provision for the office of Chief Secretary; the former office of Colonial Secretary lapsed.

This Order makes the consequential amendment to the Fugitive Offenders (Bermuda) Order 1967.
