The Telephone Amendment (No. 4) Regulations 1968

<i>Made</i>	10th April 1968
<i>Laid before Parliament</i>	11th April 1968
<i>Coming into Operation</i>	16th April 1968

I, The Right Honourable Roy Mason, M.P., Her Majesty's Postmaster General, by virtue of the power vested in me by section 1 of the Telephone Act 1951(a), as amended by sections 16 and 28 of the Post Office Act 1961(b), and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, do hereby make the following regulations:—

Interpretation

1.—(1) These regulations shall be read as one with the Telephone Regulations 1965(c) as amended(d).

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(e) applies for the interpretation of these regulations as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Connection charge

2. In Schedule 5 of the Telephone Regulations 1965 (which specifies maximum connection charges), for item 1 there shall be substituted:—

“ 1. Exchange line of which the chargeable length does not exceed 3 miles	20 - - ”

Citation and commencement

3. These regulations may be cited as “The Telephone Amendment (No. 4) Regulations 1968” and shall come into operation on the 16th April 1968.
