# The Price Stability of Imported Products (Rates of Levy No. 23) Order 1969

Made - - - 3rd November 1969

Coming into Operation - 4th November 1969

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 1(2), (4), (5), (6) and (7) of the Agriculture and Horticulture Act 1964(a) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:—

1. This order may be cited as the Price Stability of Imported Products (Rates of Levy No. 23) Order 1969, and shall come into operation on 4th November 1969.

### 2.—(1) In this order—

"the Principal Order" means the Price Stability of Imported Products (Levy Arrangements) Order 1966(b) as amended(c) and as amended by any subsequent order, and if any such order is replaced by any subsequent order the expression shall be construed as a reference to such subsequent order:

AND other expressions have the same meaning as in the Principal Order.

- (2) The Interpretation Act 1889(d) shall apply to the interpretation of this order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament and as if this order and the orders hereby revoked were Acts of Parliament.
- 3. In accordance with and subject to the provisions of Part II of the Principal Order (which provides for the charging of levies on imports of certain specified commodities)—
  - (a) the rate of general levy for such imports into the United Kingdom of any specified commodity as are described in column 2 of Part I of the Schedule to this order in relation to a tariff heading indicated in column 1 of that Part shall be the rate set forth in relation thereto in column 3 of that Part;
  - (b) the rate of country levy for such imports into the United Kingdom of any specified commodity as are described in column 2 of Part II of the Schedule to this order in relation to a tariff heading indicated in column 1 of that Part shall be the rate set forth in relation thereto in column 3 of that Part.

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This order, which comes into operation on 4th November 1969, supersedes the Price Stability of Imported Products (Rates of Levy No. 22) Order 1969. It:—

- (a) reduces to 10s. per ton both the general levy on denatured wheat and the country levy on denatured wheat grown in and consigned to the United Kingdom from Belgium, France or the Netherlands;
- (b) reduces to 5s. per ton the general levy on imports of wheat (other than seed wheat the value of which is not less than £34 per ton, denatured wheat, durum wheat and wheat which has been grown in and consigned to the United Kingdom from the U.S.S.R. or Hungary);
- (c) removes from general levy imports of wheat grown in and consigned to the United Kingdom from the U.S.S.R.;
- (d) reduces to 5s. per ton the country levy on imports of wheat (other than seed wheat the value of which is not less than £34 per ton, denatured wheat and durum wheat) which has been grown in and consigned to the United Kingdom from Belgium or France; and
- (e) reimposes unchanged the other rates of general and country levy in force immediately before the commencement of the order.
