The Approved Schools (Contributions by Local Authorities) Regulations 1969

Made	31 <i>st March</i> 1969
Coming into Operation	1st April 1969

In pursuance of the power conferred upon me by section 90(1) of the Children and Young Persons Act 1933(a), I, the Right Honourable James Callaghan, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Approved Schools (Contributions by Local Authorities) Regulations 1969 and shall come into operation on 1st April 1969.

2. The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. In Regulation 1 of the Approved Schools (Contributions by Local Authorities) Regulations 1962(c), as amended(d) (which provides that the contributions to be made by the local authority named in an approved school order to the expenses of the managers of an approved school throughout the time, except in certain specified circumstances, during which the person to whom the order relates is under the care of the said managers, shall be at the rate of twelve pounds fifteen shillings and sixpence a week) for the words "twelve pounds fifteen shillings and sixpence" there shall be substituted the words "fourteen pounds".

4. The Approved Schools (Contributions by Local Authorities) Regulations 1968(d) are hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations raise from $\pounds 12$ 15s. 6d. a week to $\pounds 14$ a week the contributions to be made by the local authority named in an approved school order towards the expenses of the managers of the school in respect of the person to whom the order relates during the time when that person is under the care of those managers.
