The Teachers' Superannuation (Amendment) Regulations 1969

Made--24th January 1969Laid before Parliament31st January 1969Coming into Operation1st February 1969

The Secretary of State for Education and Science, with the consent of the Minister for the Civil Service and after consultation with representatives of local education authorities and of teachers appearing to him to be likely to be affected, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 1 of the Teachers' Superannuation Act 1967(a) as amended by the Minister for the Civil Service Order 1968(b), hereby makes the following Regulations:—

- 1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Teachers' Superannuation (Amendment) Regulations 1969 and shall come into operation on 1st February 1969.
- (2) The Teachers' Superannuation Regulations 1967 and 1968(c) and these Regulations may be cited together as the Teachers' Superannuation Regulations 1967 to 1969.
- 2. Regulation 24 of the Teachers' Superannuation Regulations 1967 (which specifies the payments to teachers which are to be treated as emoluments) shall be amended by the addition thereto of the following paragraph:—
 - "(f) any additional payments made to teachers employed in schools recognised by the Secretary of State as schools of exceptional difficulty under the provisions of an order made under the Remuneration of Teachers Act 1965(d) or of a document referred to in such an order."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations add additional payments made to teachers employed in schools recognised by the Secretary of State as schools of exceptional difficulty to the payments which are treated as emoluments, that is, payments in respect of which contributions are not payable and which are not taken into account for the purpose of calculating superannuation allowances.
