INDUSTRIAL TRAINING

The Industrial Training (Iron and Steel Board) Order 1969

Made	27 <i>th June</i> 1969
Laid before Parliament	7th July 1969
Coming into Operation	16th July 1969

The Secretary of State after consultation with the Iron and Steel Industry Training Board and with organisations and associations of organisations appearing to be representative respectively of substantial numbers of employers engaging in the activities hereinafter mentioned and of substantial numbers of persons employed in those activities and with a body established for the purpose of carrying on under national ownership an industry in which the said activities are carried on to a substantial extent and in exercise of her powers under section 9 of the Industrial Training Act 1964(a) and of all other powers enabling her in that behalf hereby makes the following Order : ---

Citation. commencement and interpretation

1.--(1) This Order may be cited as the Industrial Training (Iron and Steel Board) Order 1969 and shall come into operation on 16th July 1969.

- (2) In this Order----
- (a) "the Act" means the Industrial Training Act 1964;
- (b) "the Board" means the Iron and Steel Industry Training Board :
- (c) "Levy Order" includes the Industrial Training Levy (Iron and Steel) Order 1965(b), the Industrial Training Levy (Iron and Steel) Order 1966(c), the Industrial Training Levy (Iron and Steel) Order 1967(d) and the Industrial Training Levy (Iron and Steel) Order 1969(e);
- (d) "the principal Order" means the Industrial Training (Iron and Steel Board) Order 1964(f).

(3) The Interpretation Act 1889(g) shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament and as if this Order and the principal Order were Acts of Parliament.

Activities of the Board

2. The activities in relation to which the Board exercises the functions conferred by the Act upon industrial training boards shall, in lieu of the activities specified in Schedule 1 to the principal Order, be the activities specified in the Schedule to this Order, and accordingly in the principal Order the latter Schedule shall be substituted for the former Schedule.

Transitional provisions

3.-(1) The chairman and other members of the Board on the day upon which this Order comes into operation shall continue to be members of the

Board and to hold and vacate their offices in accordance with the terms of the instruments appointing them to be members.

- (2) The provisions of this Order shall not-
- (a) extend the operation of a Levy Order;
- (b) affect the operation of a Levy Order in relation to the assessment of an employer within the meaning of that Order in respect of an establishment that was engaged in the relevant levy period wholly or mainly in activities included in the Schedule to this Order;
- (c) affect the operation of any assessment notice served by the Board under the provisions of a Levy Order before the date upon which this Order comes into operation or any appeal or other proceedings arising out of any such notice.

Article 2

SCHEDULE

THE IRON AND STEEL INDUSTRY

1. Subject to the provisions of this Schedule, the activities of the iron and steel industry are the following activities in so far as they are carried out in Great Britain:—

- (a) the quarrying or mining of iron ore or the treatment or preparation of iron ore for smelting;
- (b) the smelting of iron ore in a blast furnace with or without other metalliferous materials, or the production of iron by any other process;
- (c) the production of steel by any process;
- (d) when carried out in association with any of the foregoing activities—
 - (i) the quarrying of limestone;
 - (ii) the production of coke;
 - (iii) the casting of iron or steel by any process;
 - (iv) the production with or without heat of any iron or steel forgings;
 - (v) the annealing or heat treatment of steel;
- (e) the rolling, with or without heat, of iron or steel products for the purpose of reducing the cross-sectional area thereof;
- (f) the production from iron or steel of bright bars, hot finished tubes or hot finished pipes;
- (g) when carried out by an employer (or an associated company of the employer, being a company) mainly engaged in the production of iron or steel and in the production from iron or steel of hot finished tubes or hot finished pipes—
 - (i) the production of cold finished tubes or cold finished pipes;
 - (ii) the manipulation or fabrication of any tubes or pipes;
- (h) the production of tinplate, terneplate, iron or steel wire, or steel wire ropes;

- (i) when carried out in association with any of the foregoing activities the production of galvanised or other coated steel sheets;
- (j) any activities, being-
 - (i) related activities incidental or ancillary to principal activities of the iron and steel industry; or
 - (ii) activities undertaken in the administration, control or direction of one or more establishments, being establishments engaged wholly or mainly in principal activities of that industry, in related activities incidental or ancillary thereto, or in the administration, control or direction of one or more other establishments engaged in such principal or related activities;

and carried out, in either case, by the employer engaged in those principal activities or, where that employer is a company, by the company or by an associated company of the company;

- (k) any activities of industry or commerce (other than iron and steel activities) carried out at or from an establishment mainly engaged—
 - (i) in iron and steel activities; or
 - (ii) in iron and steel activities and in activities described in the Appendix to this Schedule but to a greater extent in iron and steel activities than in activities described in that Appendix in relation to any one industry.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Schedule, there shall not be included in the activities of the iron and steel industry—

- (a) the activities of any establishment engaged—
 - (i) mainly in activities not being iron and steel activities or activities described in the Appendix to this Schedule; or
 - (ii) to a less extent in iron and steel activities than in activities described in that Appendix in relation to any one industry;
- (b) the activities of any establishment engaged wholly or mainly in related activities, being activities—
 - (i) incidental or ancillary to the activities of one or more establishments (in this sub-paragraph hereafter referred to as "the principal establishment") engaged wholly or mainly in any activities not being principal activities of the iron and steel industry; and
 - (ii) carried out by the employer carrying on the principal establishment or, where that employer is a company, by the company or by an associated company of the company;
- (c) the supply of food or drink for immediate consumption.
- 3. In this Schedule unless the context otherwise requires—
- (a) "company" includes any body corporate, and "subsidiary" has the same meaning as by virtue of section 154 of the Companies Act 1948(a) it has for the purposes of that Act;
- (b) "iron" and "steel" include respectively alloy iron and alloy steel containing in each case more than fifty-five per cent. of pure iron by weight;
- (c) "iron and steel activities" means any one or more of the principal activities of the iron and steel industry and the activities included in that industry by virtue of paragraph 1(j) of this Schedule;
- (d) "office premises" has the same meaning as in section 1(2) of the Offices, Shops and Railway Premises Act 1963(b);
- (e) "principal activities of the iron and steel industry" means activities which, subject to the provisions of paragraph 2 of this Schedule, are specified in paragraph 1, other than sub-paragraphs (j) and (k) thereof, as activities of the iron and steel industry;
- (f) " production " includes any process or operation incidental or appertaining to production;

- (g) "related activities" means any of the following activities, that is to say -(i) research, development, design or drawing;
 - (ii) buying, selling, testing, advertising, packing, distribution, transport or any similar operations :
 - (iii) operations of a kind performed at office premises or laboratories, or at stores, warehouses or similar places :
 - (iv) cleaning, washing or garaging vehicles or carrying out running repairs or minor adjustments thereto;
 - (v) training of employees or apprentices.

4. For the purposes of this Schedule two companies shall be taken to be associated companies if one is a subsidiary of the other or both are subsidiaries of a third company, and "associated company" shall be construed accordingly.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

The Iron and Steel Industry Training Board was established on 3rd July 1964 by the Industrial Training (Iron and Steel Board) Order 1964 which defined the iron and steel industry in relation to which the Board exercises its functions. This Order re-defines that industry.

The principal changes in the definition of the industry are the inclusion therein of—

(a) the production of cold finished tubes or cold finished pipes;

(b) the manipulation or fabrication of any tubes or pipes;

when carried out by an employer (or associated company) mainly engaged in the production of iron or steel and in the production from iron or steel of hot finished tubes or pipes.
