## PROBATION AND AFTER-CARE

## The Probation (Allowances) (Amendment) Rules 1970

Made - - - 9th July 1970  
 Coming into Operation 1st August 1970

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Schedule 5 to the Criminal Justice Act 1948(a), as extended by section 36(4) of the Justices of the Peace Act 1949(b) as amended by section 31 of the Administration of Justice Act 1964(c), I hereby make the following Rules:—

1. These Rules may be cited as the Probation (Allowances) (Amendment) Rules 1970 and shall come into operation on 1st August 1970.

2. Rule 6 of the Probation Allowances Rules 1964(d), as amended (e), shall be amended by the substitution for the words “probation committee” wherever they occur of the words “probation and after-care committee”.

3. Schedule 1 to the said Rules shall be amended as follows:—

- (a) in paragraph 3(1) the words “2·75d.”, “3·5d.” and “4d.” shall be substituted for the words “2d.”, “2½d.” and “3d.” respectively;
- (b) in paragraph 3(2) the words “4d.” shall be substituted for the words “3d.”;
- (c) in paragraph 3(2)(i) the words “5·75d.” shall be substituted for the words “4d.”;
- (d) for paragraph 3(2)(ii) and (iii) there shall be substituted—
  - “(ii) for the use of a motor car or tri-car of cylinder capacity—
    - (a) exceeding 500 c.c. but not exceeding 999 c.c., 11·25d. a mile;
    - (b) exceeding 999 c.c. but not exceeding 1199 c.c., 12·75d. a mile;
    - (c) exceeding 1199 c.c., 14·25d. a mile.”;
- (e) in paragraph 3(3) the words “4d.” shall be substituted for the words “3d.” in both places where they occur.

4. Paragraph 1(1) of Schedule 2 to the said Rules shall be amended by the substitution of the words “19s.”, “35s.”, “50s.”, “59s.” and “110s.” for the words “12s. 6d.”, “23s.”, “33s.”, “40s.” and “68s.” respectively.

5. There shall be substituted for the form contained in Schedule 3 to the said Rules the form contained in the Schedule to these Rules.
