**The Rate Support Grant (Increase) Order 1970**

*Made - - - - - 20th November 1970*  
*Laid before the*  
*House of Commons 26th November 1970*  
*Coming into Operation 11th December 1970*

The Secretary of State for the Environment, with the consent of the Treasury and after consultation with the associations of local authorities appearing to him to be concerned and with the local authority with whom consultation appeared to him to be desirable, in exercise of his powers under section 3 of the Local Government Act 1966(a) and section 66 of the Children and Young Persons Act 1969(b), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:—

*Title, commencement and interpretation*

1.—(1) This order may be cited as the Rate Support Grant (Increase) Order 1970 and shall come into operation on the day following the day on which it is approved by a resolution of the Commons House of Parliament.

(2) In this order any reference to a numbered section shall be construed as a reference to the section bearing that number in the Local Government Act 1966 and any reference to a numbered paragraph shall be construed as a reference to the paragraph bearing that number in Part I of Schedule 1 to that Act.

*Further amendment of Rate Support Grant Order 1968*

2. For the items set out in column (2) of the following table, prescribed by the Rate Support Grant Order 1968(c) as amended by the Rate Support Grant (Increase) Order 1969(d) for the purposes of rate support grants for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71 in respect of the matters indicated in column (1), there shall be substituted the items specified in column (3).

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of the Order.)*

This Order came into operation on 11th December 1970 and (under the powers of section 3(1) of the Local Government Act 1966) relates to the financial years 1969-70 and 1970-71. It—

- (a) increases the aggregate amounts of the rate support grants payable under Part I of the Local Government Act 1966 to councils of counties, county boroughs and county districts in England and Wales, the Greater London Council, the councils of London Boroughs, the Common Council of the City of London and the Council of the Isles of Scilly ;
- (b) increases two of the constituent elements of the rate support grants, namely the needs element (which is not payable to councils of county districts or, subject to the provision to the contrary by regulations under the Act, to the Greater London Council) and the resources element ;  
and
- (c) varies certain of the matters prescribed by the Rate Support Grant Order 1968 as amended by the Rate Support Grant (Increase) Order 1969 in relation to the distribution of the needs element.
