BETTING AND GAMING

The Gaming Clubs (Licensing) (Amendment) Regulations 1970

Made - - - - 17th February 1970 Laid before Parliament 25th February 1970 Coming into Operation 28th February 1970

In pursuance of sections 22(3) and 51 of the Gaming Act 1968(a), and after consultation with the Gaming Board for Great Britain, I hereby make the following Regulations:—

- 1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Gaming Clubs (Licensing) (Amendment) Regulations 1970 and shall come into operation on 28th February 1970.
 - (2) These Regulations do not extend to Scotland.
- 2. Schedule 1 to the Gaming Clubs (Licensing) Regulations 1969(\mathbf{b}) shall be amended—
 - (a) by inserting, in the appropriate alphabetical positions in the list of county boroughs in that Schedule, the words "Luton", "Scarborough" and "Southport";
 - (b) by inserting, at the end of the list of non-county boroughs in that Schedule, the word "Ryde"; and
 - (c) by inserting, before the words "London boroughs" in that Schedule, the words—

"Urban districts
Sandown—Shanklin".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

Schedule 1 to the Gaming Clubs (Licensing) Regulations 1969 specifies those areas in England and Wales in which licences may be granted under the Gaming Act 1968 in respect of games not confined to bingo, bridge and whist. These Regulations amend that Schedule by adding to it the county boroughs of Luton, Scarborough and Southport, the non-county borough of Ryde and the urban district of Sandown—Shanklin.
