# The Anti-Dumping Duty (No. 2) Order 1968 (Amendment) Order 1970

Made - - - - 20th February 1970
Laid before the House of
Commons - - - 27th February 1970
Coming into Operation - 1st March 1970

The Board of Trade, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by sections 1, 2, 10(3), 15(4) and 18(2) of the Customs Duties (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1969(a), hereby make the following Order:—

- 1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Anti-Dumping Duty (No. 2) Order 1968 (Amendment) Order 1970 and shall come into operation on 1st March 1970.
- (2) The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament and as if this Order and the Order hereby amended were Acts of Parliament.
- 2. The Anti-Dumping Duty (No. 2) Order 1968(c) (which imposes antidumping duties on certain files and rasps originating in Portugal and Australia) shall cease to have effect so far as it applies to files and rasps originating in Portugal.
- 3. The Anti-Dumping Duty (Temporary Suspension) Order 1969(d) is hereby revoked.
