Order 1970 Revocation Order 1970***Made - - - - - 24th March 1970*

Whereas Her Majesty, in pursuance of the Regency Acts 1937 to 1953, was pleased, by Letters Patent dated the 27th day of February 1970, to delegate to the following Counsellors of State (subject to the exceptions hereinafter mentioned) or any two or more of them, that is to say, His Royal Highness The Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother, His Royal Highness The Prince Charles, Prince of Wales, Her Royal Highness The Princess Margaret, Countess of Snowdon, His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester and His Royal Highness Prince William of Gloucester, full power and authority during the period of Her Majesty's absence from the United Kingdom to summon and hold on Her Majesty's behalf Her Privy Council and to signify thereat Her Majesty's approval for anything for which Her Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas Her Majesty was further pleased to except from the number of the said Counsellors of State His Royal Highness The Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, His Royal Highness The Prince Charles, Prince of Wales, Her Royal Highness The Princess Margaret, Countess of Snowdon and His Royal Highness Prince William of Gloucester while absent from the United Kingdom:

And whereas the Minister of Housing and Local Government made the London Authorities (Transfer of Housing Estates etc.) Order 1970(a) on 5th February 1970 in exercise of his powers under sections 23(3) and 84 of the London Government Act 1963(b), and laid the said Order before Parliament on 18th February 1970:

And whereas under the said sections 23(3) and 84 the said Order was subject to annulment in pursuance of a resolution of either House of Parliament:

And whereas on 18th March 1970 the Commons House of Parliament resolved that an Address be presented to Her Majesty praying that the said Order be annulled:

And whereas in pursuance of the powers conferred on Her Majesty by section 5(1) of the Statutory Instruments Act 1946(a) Her Majesty may by Order in Council revoke the said Order:

Now therefore, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother and Her Royal Highness The Princess Margaret, Countess of Snowdon, being authorised thereto by the said Letters Patent, and in pursuance of the powers conferred on Her Majesty by the said section 5(1) or otherwise in Her Majesty vested, do hereby, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, on Her Majesty's behalf order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the London Authorities (Transfer of Housing Estates etc.) Order 1970 Revocation Order 1970.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(b) applies for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2.—(1) The London Authorities (Transfer of Housing Estates etc.) Order 1970 is hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation effected by this Order is without prejudice to the validity of anything previously done thereunder or to the making of a new Order.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order, which is made under section 5(1) of the Statutory Instruments Act 1946, effects the revocation of the London Authorities (Transfer of Housing Estates etc.) Order 1970 following the presentation of an Address to Her Majesty by the Commons House of Parliament praying that the said Order be annulled.
