## **EDUCATION, SCOTLAND**

# The Teaching Council (Scotland) Act 1965 (Amendment of Constitution of the Council) Order 1970

Made	24th March 1970

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by paragraph 6 of Part I of Schedule 1 to the Teaching Council (Scotland) Act 1965(a) and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, and after consultation with the General Teaching Council for Scotland and the other bodies and persons who appear to me to be concerned, I hereby make the following order:—

#### Citation and commencement

- 1.—(1) This order may be cited as the Teaching Council (Scotland) Act 1965 (Amendment of Constitution of the Council) Order 1970.
  - (2) The provisions of this order shall come into operation as follows:—
    - (a) paragraphs (c) and (e) of article 3, and article 4, shall come into operation on 1st May 1970;
    - (b) the remaining provisions shall come into operation on 1st February 1971.

## Interpretation

2. In this order, "the order of 1969" means the Teaching Council (Scotland) Act 1965 (Amendment of Constitution of the Council) Order 1969(b).

Amendment of Part I of Schedule 1 to the Teaching Council (Scotland) Act 1965

3. In Part I of Schedule 1 to the Teaching Council (Scotland) Act 1965 as amended by the order of 1969—

(a) 1965 c. 19.

**(b)** S.I. 1969/586 (1969 I, p. 1559).

- (a) in paragraph 1(1), for the numbers "44" and "25" there shall be substituted the numbers "49" and "30" respectively;
- (b) for sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 1 there shall be substituted the following sub-paragraph:—
  - "(2) The elected members shall comprise:—
  - (a) 5 registered teachers employed in colleges of education, including 4 (but not more than 4) principals;
  - (b) 3 registered teachers employed in further education centres;
  - (c) 11 registered teachers employed in secondary schools;
  - (d) 11 registered teachers employed in primary schools.";
- (c) in paragraph 4(1) for the words "four years six months" there shall be substituted the words "five years";
- (d) in paragraph 4(2) after head (c) there shall be inserted the following head:—
  - "(d) where, being an elected member, he ceases to be employed in the category of educational establishment in respect of which he was elected;"
- (e) in paragraph 5(3) for the words "four years six months" there shall be substituted the words "five years".

Revocation of the order of 1969

4. The order of 1969 is hereby revoked.

### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order extends the period of office of the initial membership of the General Teaching Council for Scotland from four years six months to five years. It also alters the constitution of the Council, as from 1st February 1971, by increasing the representation of registered teachers, abolishing certain electoral distinctions between headteachers and others and requiring an elected member to vacate office on his ceasing to serve in the category of educational establishment in respect of which he was elected.
