PROBATION AND AFTER-CARE**The Probation (Conditions of Service) (Amendment) Rules 1970**

Made - - - - - 1st May 1970

Coming into Operation 1st May 1970

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Schedule 5 to the Criminal Justice Act 1948(a) and section 1 of the Police, Fire and Probation Officers Remuneration Act 1956(b), I hereby make the following Rules :—

1.—(1) These Rules may be cited as the Probation (Conditions of Service) (Amendment) Rules 1970.

(2) These Rules shall come into operation forthwith and shall take effect from 1st April 1970.

2. For Schedule 1 to the Probation (Conditions of Service) Rules 1965(c), as substituted by Rule 2 of the Probation (Conditions of Service) (Amendment) Rules 1968(d), there shall be substituted the following Schedule :—

“(c) such other period of employment (not being employment as a probation officer) before the commencement of his current period of continuous service as the Secretary of State at the request of the probation and after-care committee employing him approves.”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Rules.)

These Rules amend the Probation (Conditions of Service) Rules 1965 by introducing higher scales of annual salary for senior probation officers and by enabling the Secretary of State to approve, in the case of the former rank, the counting of outside service for calculating the starting point on the salary scale. The Rules, in pursuance of the power conferred by section 1 of the Police, Fire and Probation Officers Remuneration Act 1956, take effect from 1st April 1970.
