The Hijacking Act 1971 (Isle of Man) Order 1971

Made - - - - - 27th October 1971
Coming into Operation 15th November 1971

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 27th day of October 1971

Present,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by section 6(2) of the Hijacking Act 1971(a), is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Hijacking Act 1971 (Isle of Man) Order 1971 and shall come into operation on 15th November 1971.
2. The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply for the purpose of the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
3. Sections 1, 2, 4 and 5 of the Hijacking Act 1971 shall extend to the Isle of Man with, in the case of sections 1, 2 and 5, the adaptations and modifications specified in the Schedule to this Order.

SCHEDULE

ADAPTATIONS AND MODIFICATIONS IN SECTIONS 1, 2 AND 5
OF THE HIJACKING ACT 1971

1. In section 1(1) and (2)(ii) for the words "United Kingdom" there shall be substituted the words "Isle of Man".
2. In section 1(2)(iii) there shall be inserted after the words "United Kingdom", in each place where they occur, the words "or the Isle of Man".
3. In section 1(4)(b) for the words "United Kingdom" there shall be substituted the words "Isle of Man".

4. For section 2 there shall be substituted the following section:—

“2. Without prejudice to section 1 of the Tokyo Convention Act 1967(a) as extended to the Isle of Man by the Tokyo Convention Act 1967 (Isle of Man) Order 1969(b) (which makes similar provision for offences on board British-controlled aircraft), where a person (of whatever nationality) does on board any aircraft (wherever registered) and while outside the Isle of Man any act which, if done in the Isle of Man would constitute the offence of murder, attempted murder, manslaughter, culpable homicide or assault or an offence under section 33, 35, 36, 37, 38, 43 or 44 of the Criminal Code 1872 (an Act of Tynwald), or section 2 of the Explosive Substances Act 1883 (an Act of Tynwald), his act shall constitute that offence if it is done in connection with the offence of hijacking committed or attempted by him on board that aircraft.”.

5. In section 5(1) there shall be substituted for paragraphs (a) and (b) the words “in the Isle of Man except by or with the consent of the Attorney General for the Isle of Man”.

6. In section 5(2) before the words “the following” there shall be inserted the words “as extended to the Isle of Man by the Visiting Forces Act (Application to the Isle of Man) Order 1962(c).

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order extends the operative provisions of the Hijacking Act 1971 to the Isle of Man with the adaptations and modifications set out in the Schedule to the Order.
