The Anti-Dumping Duty Order 1968 (Revocation) Order 1971

Made - - - 8th November 1971
Laid before the House of Commons 12th November 1971
Coming into Operation 13th November 1971

The Secretary of State, in exercise of his powers under sections 1, 2, 10(3), 15(4) and 18(2) of the Customs Duties (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1969(a), hereby orders as follows:—

- 1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Anti-Dumping Duty Order 1968 (Revocation) Order 1971 and shall come into operation on 13th November 1971.
- (2) The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament and as if this Order and the Order hereby revoked were Acts of Parliament.
 - 2. The Anti-Dumping Duty Order 1968(c) is hereby revoked.

This Order removes the anti-dumping duty imposed in 1968 on certain copolymers (including some silicone polyether copolymer surfactants) produced in the USA by the Union Carbide Corporation and the Dow Corning Corporation.
