**The Pensions Appeal Tribunals (England and Wales)  
(Amendment) Rules 1971**

The Lord Chancellor, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by paragraph 5(4) of the Schedule to the Pensions Appeal Tribunals Act 1943(a) and after consultation with the Council on Tribunals in accordance with section 10 of the Tribunals and Inquiries Act 1971(b), hereby makes the following Rules :—

1. These Rules may be cited as the Pensions Appeal Tribunals (England and Wales) (Amendment) Rules 1971 and shall come into operation on 15th December 1971.

2. The Pensions Appeal Tribunals (England and Wales) Rules 1971(c) shall be amended as follows :—

In Rule 27(3) (which relates to the expenses allowable to appellants and their attendants), for the words “not exceeding the sum of £4·00 per day” there shall be substituted “not exceeding the sum of £4·75 per day (£2·37½ *per half day*)”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of the Rules.)*

These Rules amend the Pensions Appeal Tribunals (England and Wales) Rules 1971 by increasing from £4·00 to £4·75 the maximum allowance payable to an appellant or his representative or attendant for loss of time, and further specifies £2·37½ as being the maximum allowance payable for a half a day.
