In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Schedule 5 to the Criminal Justice Act 1948(a), as extended by section 36 of the Justices of the Peace Act 1949(b) (as amended by section 4 of the Justices of the Peace Act 1968(c)), I hereby make the following Rules:—

- 1. These Rules may be cited as the Probation (Allowances) (Amendment) Rules 1971 and shall come into operation on 1st January 1972.
- 2. Rule 5 of the Probation (Allowances) Rules 1971(d) shall be amended by the substitution of the words "£2.375" and "£4.75" for the words "£2.00" and "£4.00" respectively.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

These Rules increase the minimum rates of financial loss allowances payable to members of probation and after-care committees and case committees. The new minimum rates are £4.75, if the time involved exceeds 4 hours in a 24 hour period, and £2.375 in other cases.
