The Coypus (Keeping) (Amendment) Regulations 1971

Made - - - - Coming into Operation

17th December 1971 1st January 1972

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, the Secretary of State for Scotland and the Secretary of State for Wales, acting jointly, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 2 of the Destructive Imported Animals Act 1932(a), as read with article 3 of, and paragraph 5 of Schedule 2 to, the Transfer of Functions (Wales) Order 1969(b), and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, with the approval of the Treasury hereby make the following regulations:—

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Coypus (Keeping) (Amendment) Regulations 1971, and shall come into operation on 1st January 1972.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(c) shall apply to the interpretation of these regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Amendment of the principal regulations

2. The Coypus (Keeping) Regulations 1967(d), as amended (e), shall be further amended by substituting in regulation 4(2) thereof for the figure "£6.50".
