**The Industrial Training (Financing of Agricultural Training)
Order 1971**

<i>Made</i> - - -	9th March 1971
<i>Laid before Parliament</i>	16th March 1971
<i>Coming into Operation</i>	31st March 1971

The Secretary of State for Employment after approving proposals (with which was included an estimate of expenses in relation to activities in agriculture) submitted by the Agricultural, Horticultural and Forestry Industry Training Board (hereinafter called "the Board") for the exercise of the Board's functions under section 2 of the Industrial Training Act 1964(a) and in pursuance of section 104 of the Agriculture Act 1970(b) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf hereby makes the following Order:—

Title, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Industrial Training (Financing of Agricultural Training) Order 1971 and shall come into operation on 31st March 1971.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(c) shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Certificate of Expenses

2. It is hereby certified that the sum of £1,610,000 is the amount required by the Board for meeting expenses (other than expenses by way of interest on, or repayment of, any loan) to be incurred by the Board between 1st April 1971 and 31st March 1972 in the exercise of the Board's functions in relation to activities in agriculture.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

By this Order the Secretary of State for Employment, in pursuance of section 104 of the Agriculture Act 1970, certifies the amount required by the Agricultural, Horticultural and Forestry Industry Training Board for meeting expenses (other than expenses by way of interest on, or repayment of, any loan) to be incurred by the Board between 1st April 1971 and 31st March 1972 in the exercise of the Board's functions in relation to activities in agriculture.

By virtue of section 104 of the said Act this amount is not to be raised by a levy under section 4 of the Industrial Training Act 1964 but is to be paid to the Board by the Secretary of State.
