The Judicial Offices (Salaries) Order 1972

Laid before Parliament in draft

Made - - - 17th July 1972

Whereas a draft of the following Order was laid before Parliament and approved by resolution of each House of Parliament:

Now, therefore, the Lord Chancellor, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 1(4) and (5) of the Judicial Offices (Salaries and Pensions) Act 1957(a), and with the consent of the Treasury, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Judicial Offices (Salaries) Order 1972.
2. There shall be paid to the chief of the metropolitan magistrates a salary of £9,350 a year instead of the salary of £7,850 a year now payable, and to every metropolitan magistrate other than the chief of them a salary of £8,350 a year instead of the salary of £6,850 a year now payable.
3. The Judicial Offices (Salaries) Order 1970(b) is hereby revoked.
