The Witnesses' Allowances (Amendment) Regulations 1972*Made* - - - - 20th January 1972*Coming into Operation* 14th February 1972

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section 12 of the Costs in Criminal Cases Act 1952(a), as amended by section 52 of, and Schedule 5 to, the Criminal Appeal Act 1968(b), I hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Witnesses' Allowances (Amendment) Regulations 1972 and shall come into operation on 14th February 1972.

2. Regulation 7 of the Witnesses' Allowances Regulations 1971(c), as amended(d), shall be amended by the substitution of the words "£4.75" and "£2.375" for the words "£4" and "£2" respectively.

3. Regulation 10(1)(a) of the said Regulations shall be amended by the substitution of the words "£4.75" for the words "£4".
