**The National Health Service (General Dental Services)
 (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 1972**

<i>Made - - - -</i>	<i>28th January 1972</i>
<i>Laid before Parliament</i>	<i>8th February 1972</i>
<i>Coming into Operation</i>	<i>1st March 1972</i>

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 39 of the National Health Service (Scotland) Act 1947(a), as amended by section 11 of the National Health Service (Amendment) Act 1949(b), and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I hereby make the following regulations:—

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the National Health Service (General Dental Services) (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 1972 and shall come into operation on 1st March 1972.

(2) In these regulations:—

“the principal regulations” means the National Health Service (General Dental Services) (Scotland) Regulations 1966(c) as amended (d); and

“regulation 27” means regulation 27 of the principal regulations as amended by regulation 3(3) of the National Health Service (General Dental Services) (Scotland) Amendment (No. 2) Regulations 1970(e) (which provided for a new scale of fees for treatment).

(3) The Interpretation Act 1889(f) shall apply for the interpretation of these regulations as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament, and as if these regulations were an Act of Parliament.

2. Regulation 4 of the National Health Service (General Dental Services) (Scotland) Amendment (No. 2) Regulations 1970 shall cease to have effect.

3. The principal regulations shall be amended as follows:—

(1) In regulation 29 (which provides for additional remuneration for the provision of treatment elsewhere than at the practitioner’s surgery) for the amount of £1 : 5:0 (£1.25) in paragraph (1) there shall be substituted the amount of £1.50 and for the amount of 2s 0d there shall be substituted the amount of 30p.

- (2) In paragraph 3(2)(b) of Part I of Schedule 1 (which deals with limited treatment) for the amount of £2:4:0 (£2:20) there shall be substituted the amount of £2:30.
- (3) In Category II of Schedule 2 (which deals with "treatment for which the prior approval of the Board is required") there shall be added—
- (a) in column A between the numbers 5 and 8 the figure "6"
 - (b) in column B between items of treatment opposite item numbers 5 and 8 in column A the following paragraph

"Any filling or any combination of types of filling in one tooth where pin or screw retention is used".

- (4) For category IV of Schedule 2 there shall be substituted the following

"IV Dentures, 14, 19(a)(i) and (ii) bridges and other appliances other than orthodontic appliances	Provision of dentures (other than (a) the provision of dentures in synthetic resin carrying one or more incisor or canine teeth or 4 or more premolar or molar teeth, necessitated by the extraction during the same course of treatment of a tooth or teeth of a patient aged 21 years or over, or (b) the replacement of dentures, except where free replacement is sought in cases of loss or damage or where metal based dentures are to replace dentures in other materials).
14(d) and 15(b)	Provision or renewal of soft lining or soft partial lining to a new or existing denture where this is required on account of the abnormal anatomical condition of the patient's alveolus.
15(a)(ii)	Relining or rebasing of dentures accompanied by repairs and/or additions.
18	Backing and tagging of teeth on non-metallic based dentures.
19(b)	Repairs to metal dentures at a cost exceeding the maximum fee allowable for repairs under item 16.
19(c)	Additions to metal dentures.
20	Bridges (other than re-cementing a bridge).
21(a)	Provision of obturators.
21(b)	Repairs to obturators at a cost exceeding the maximum fee allowable for repairs under item 16.
21(c)	Treatment involving splints or other appliances, except repairs at a cost not exceeding the maximum fee allowable under item 16."

- (5) For Parts I to VI of Schedule 5 (which sets out the scale of fees for dental treatment) there shall be substituted the provisions set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

4.—(1) Subject to the following provisions of this regulation, these regulations shall not apply to general dental services provided under a contract or arrangement entered into or made before 1st March 1972 and such services shall continue to be subject to the provisions of the regulations in force immediately before that date, other than the provisions thereof ceasing to have effect by virtue of Regulation 2 hereof.

(2) In respect of an advice of payment from the Board to a Council dated during the period beginning with 1st April 1971 and ending with 29th February 1972, the Council shall pay to a practitioner an additional sum equal to 5·8 per cent of the amounts authorised for payment.

(3) Where an advice of payment from the Board to a Council dated on or after 1st March 1972 is in respect of a contract or arrangement entered into or made on or after 1st October 1970 and before 1st March 1972 the Council shall pay to a practitioner in addition to the fees authorised under Regulation 27 a sum equal to 5·8 per cent of the amount of these fees.

(4) Where an advice of payment from the Board to a Council dated on or after 1st March 1972 is in respect of a contract or arrangement entered into or made on or after 1st April 1969 and before 1st October 1970, the Council shall pay to a practitioner in addition to the fees authorised under Regulation 27 a sum equal to 26·8 per cent of the amount of these fees.

(5) Where an advice of payment from the Board to a Council dated on or after 1st March 1972 is in respect of a contract or arrangement entered into or made before 1st April 1969 the Council shall pay to a practitioner in addition to the fees authorised under Regulation 27 a sum equal to 30·0 per cent of the amount of these fees.

SCHEDULE

PART I—DIAGNOSIS

1. Clinical examination and report... .. £0·64
Provided that—

- (1) only one fee shall be payable during a course of treatment;
- (2) no fee shall be payable for:—
 - (a) an examination in respect of repairs to dentures for edentulous patients,
 - (b) a group examination in schools or institutions,
 - (c) an examination of a person aged 21 years or over if the same practitioner† has been paid or is entitled to be paid for an examination and report on that person made at any time during any of the 5 months preceding the month during which a further examination is made,

(d) an examination of a person under 21 years of age if the same practitioner† has been paid or is entitled to be paid for an examination and report on that person made within the preceding three months;

(3) in the case of a woman who is or has been pregnant and who is not edentulous, in addition to the examinations for which payment may otherwise be made under this item, a fee shall be payable for one examination during the antenatal and postnatal period and all such examinations may be carried out at any time during that period.‡

PART II. CONSERVATIVE TREATMENT

A. *Periodontal Treatment*

3. Scaling, including the removal of calculus and other deposits from the teeth, the provision of prophylactic or other necessary treatment for all ordinary or simple disorders of the gums and any necessary

oral hygiene instruction, for persons aged 16 or over at the beginning of a course of treatment:—

(a) Scaling and gum treatment (except cases under (b)) £1·00

*(b) Scaling and gum treatment to be followed by extraction of the teeth charted for scaling, gum treatment and extraction during the same course of treatment Such fee as the Board may approve, not exceeding £0·84.

*Provided that no fee shall be payable where the last course of treatment in respect of which provision was made for payment under item 3(a) or (b) to the same practitioner† commenced at any time during any of the 5 months preceding the month in which the further treatment is to be done, unless the prior approval of the Board has been obtained.

4. Treatment urgently required for acute infective conditions of the gingivae/oral mucosa, including any necessary oral hygiene instruction:

*5. Other periodontal treatment including any necessary oral hygiene instruction, periodontal surgery and protracted scaling (estimates to include an outline of proposed treatment):

(a) with periodontal surgery Such fee as the Board may approve.
(b) without periodontal surgery Such fee as the Board may approve up to a maximum of £5·80.

B. Restorative Treatment

6. Fillings (including any dressings, pulp capping and other necessary preparatory treatment), except fillings in deciduous teeth of children under 16 years. The fillings to which this scale applies shall be permanent in character. Fee per filling:—

(a) amalgam filling in:

(i) a single surface cavity £0·84 with a maximum of £0·84 for 2 or more such fillings in any one surface of a tooth and a maximum of £1·14 for 2 or more such fillings per tooth not all in one surface.

(ii) a mesial-occlusal-distal cavity inclusive of any extension of such a cavity in a molar or pre-molar tooth £1·90

PART IV. DENTURES, BRIDGES AND SPECIAL APPLIANCES OTHER THAN ORTHODONTIC APPLIANCES

Fees for the provision of dentures cover the provision of all necessary clasps, rests and strengtheners and all adjustments needed within a reasonable period of time after completion.

Provided that no fee in excess of £3.10 per denture shall be payable under item 17 or for any combination of treatment under items 16 and 17.

 Fee per course £0.36
27. Taking of material for pathological or bacteriological examination, etc:
 Fee per course £0.50
28. Treatment for arrest of abnormal haemorrhage, including abnormal haemorrhage following dental treatment provided otherwise than as part of general dental services:
 Fee per visit for arrest of bleeding or for administration of associated after-care £1.24

Provided that—

- (i) the same practitioner† who arrests bleeding may not also be paid for the administration of after-care;
- (ii) where the treatment consists solely of the removal of plugs and/or stitches the fee shall be only £0.62;
- (iii) the maximum fee per course of treatment shall be £3.00 or such higher sum as the Board may in special circumstances approve.

- *29. Fee for any other treatment not included in this scale Such fee as the Board may approve.

†Reference in this scale of fees to dental treatment by the same practitioner shall include also dental treatment by his principal or the partner of either or by the assistant of any of them, and where the practitioner is employed by a body corporate shall include treatment by another employee of that body.

*See schedule 2 for treatment requiring prior approval.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations further amend the National Health Service (General Dental Services) (Scotland) Regulations 1966 by providing for a new scale of fees and for certain additional payments for practitioners, other than salaried practitioners, providing general dental services; and provide for changes in Schedule 12 of the principal regulations consequent upon changes in the description of treatments covered by the scale of fees.

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
