WELSH LANGUAGE

The Welsh Courts (Interpreters) Rules 1972

Made - - - 31st January 1972

Coming into Operation 28th February 1972

The Lord Chancellor, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 3 of the Welsh Courts Act 1942(a) and with the consent of the Treasury, hereby makes the following Rules:—

1. These Rules may be cited as the Welsh Courts (Interpreters) Rules 1972 and shall come into operation on 28th February 1972.

2. For the scale of fees payable to interpreters, which is set out in Appendix II to the Welsh Courts (Oaths and Interpreters) Rules 1943(b), as amended by the Welsh Courts (Interpreters) Rules 1959(c), there shall be substituted the following scale:

"SCALE OF FEES TO INTERPRETERS

	Crown Court	Other courts
For every day on which the interpreter attends the court for a period of—		
Four hours or more	£7·00	£5·00
Less than four hours	£3·50	£2·50

On any day on which the interpreter is required to attend the court both before and after an adjournment, the time occupied by the adjournment is to be included in the calculation of the period."
