**The Jurors' Allowances (Scotland) Amendment
Regulations 1973**

Made - - - 26th June 1973
Coming into Operation 2nd July 1973

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by sections 24(1) and 32(1) of the Juries Act 1949(a), as amended by the Juries Act 1954(b), and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf and as read with the Minister for the Civil Service Order 1971(c), I hereby, with the consent of the Minister for the Civil Service, make the following regulations:—

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Jurors' Allowances (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 1973 and shall come into operation on 2nd July 1973.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(d) shall apply for the interpretation of these regulations as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. In regulation 5 of the Jurors' Allowances (Scotland) Regulations 1971(e) as amended(f) (which relates to compensation for loss of earnings or additional expense) for the expressions "£2·37½", "£4·75" and "£9·50" there shall be substituted the expressions "£2·75", "£5·50" and "£11" respectively.
