The Secretary of State for Education and Science, in exercise of powers conferred by section 4(2) of the National Gallery and Tate Gallery Act 1954^(a) and now vested in her^(b), hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the National Gallery (Lending Outside the United Kingdom) Order 1973 and shall come into operation on 28th July 1973.

2. The loan by the National Gallery Trustees to the Rijksmuseum, Amsterdam, Holland, for a period of five years from 28th July 1973, of the picture "The Militia Company of Captain Banning Cocq" ("The Night Watch") after Rembrandt, numbered 289 in the Catalogue of the National Gallery, is hereby approved.
