Certificates) Regulations 1973***Made* - - - 31st January 1973*Laid before Parliament* 8th February 1973*Coming into Operation* 1st March 1973

The Secretary of State, in exercise of his powers under sections 67 and 68(2) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971(a) hereby makes the following regulations:—

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Town and Country Planning (Industrial Development Certificates) Regulations 1973 and shall come into operation on 1st March 1973.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply to the interpretation of these regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. No industrial development certificate shall be required in respect of the erection of any industrial building in the area described in the Schedule hereto, or in respect of a change of use whereby premises (not being an industrial building) in that area will become such a building.

SCHEDULE

The area referred to in regulation 2 of these regulations is the area designated by the Skelmersdale New Town (Designation) Order 1961(c) as varied by the Skelmersdale New Town (Designation) Amendment Order 1969(d) as the site of a proposed new town.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations direct that an industrial development certificate shall no longer be required for the erection of any industrial building in the area of Skelmersdale New Town or for a change of use as a result of which premises in that area which are not an industrial building will become an industrial building.
