WATER RESOURCES, ENGLAND AND WALES The Thames Conservancy (Farmoor Discharge) Order 1973

Made -30th October 1973

Coming into Operation 14th November 1973

The Secretary of State for the Environment, in exercise of his powers under section 1 of the Water Resources Act 1971(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby orders as follows:---

1.-(1) This order may be cited as the Thames Conservancy (Farmoor Citation and Discharge) Order 1973, and shall come into operation on 14th November commence-1973.

(2) This order shall be included among the enactments which may be cited together as the Thames Conservancy Acts and Orders 1932 to 1973.

2.-(1) In this order "the Conservators" means the Conservators of Interprethe River Thames.

(2) In this order a group of two letters and eight figures identifying a point represents the map co-ordinates of that point estimated to the nearest ten metres on the grid of the national reference system used by the Ordnance Survey on its maps and plans.

(3) The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply for the interpretation of this order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. The Conservators are hereby authorised to discharge water by means Power to of the outlet to be provided at National Grid Reference SP 45240615 discharge water. into the Filchampstead Brook at a rate not exceeding 30 million gallons per day.
