# The Pensions Increase (Compensation to Clerks to General Commissioners) Regulations 1973

Made - - - 20th November 1973

Laid before Parliament 29th November 1973

Coming into Operation 21st December 1973

The Minister for the Civil Service, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 5(2) and (4) of the Pensions (Increase) Act 1971(a) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Pensions Increase (Compensation to Clerks to General Commissioners) Regulations 1973, and shall come into operation on 21st December 1973.
- 2. The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply for the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 3. The Pensions (Increase) Act 1971 shall have effect in relation to a pension payable under Part IV of the Clerks to General Commissioners (Compensation) Regulations 1973(c) as if it were specified in Part I of Schedule 2 to that Act.
- 4. Any increase of pension payable by virtue of these Regulations shall take effect in respect of any period beginning on or after 1st September 1971.

## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations provide for the payment of increases under the Pensions (Increase) Act 1971 on long-term compensation payable under Part IV of the Clerks to General Commissioners (Compensation) Regulations 1973 to or in respect of part-time Clerks to General Commissioners who suffer loss of employment or loss or diminution of emoluments in consequence of adjustments of the divisions for which the General Commissioners act.

The Regulations have retrospective effect from 1st September 1971 by virtue of section 5(4) of the Act.
