LANDING AND SALE OF SEA FISH

The Hake (Regulation of Landing) Order 1973

Made - - - - 28th February 1973
Laid before Parliament 9th March 1973
Coming into Operation 1st April 1973

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Secretaries of State respectively concerned with the sea fishing industry in Scotland and Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by sections 6 and 15 of the Sea Fish (Conservation) Act 1967(a) as the latter section is amended by section 22(1) of, and paragraph 38 of Part II of Schedule 1 to, the Sea Fisheries Act 1968(b) and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, after consultation with the Secretary of State for Trade and Industry(c), hereby make the following Order:—

Citation and Commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Hake (Regulation of Landing) Order 1973 and shall come into operation on 1st April 1973.

Interpretation

2.—(1) In this Order:—

“specified period” means the period from 1st April 1973 to 30th April 1973, both dates inclusive;

“specified waters” means those waters in the North-West Atlantic Ocean which are bounded by the parallels of 39° 50'N and 40° 20'N and the meridians of 69° 00'W and 71° 40'W.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(d) shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Prohibition on Landing

3. Subject to Article 4 of this Order, the landing in the United Kingdom of red hake (*Urophycis chuss*) and silver hake (*Merluccius bilinearis*) caught in the specified waters during the specified period (hereinafter called “regulated fish”), is hereby prohibited.

Exception from the Prohibition on Landing

4. Notwithstanding the prohibition contained in Article 3 of this Order, regulated fish may be landed in the United Kingdom if:—

- (a) the regulated fish were caught in the course of fishing for sea fish of any description other than red hake (*Urophycis chuss*) and silver hake (*Merluccius bilinearis*); and
- (b) the regulated fish are comprised in a catch the whole or part of which was taken in the specified waters and do not exceed in weight one-tenth of the total weight of the catch landed in the United Kingdom or, if only part of the catch was taken in the specified waters, one-tenth of the total weight of that part so landed.

Enforcement

5. For the purpose of the enforcement of this Order, there are hereby conferred on every British sea-fishery officer the powers of a British sea-fishery officer under section 8(2) and (3) of the Sea Fisheries Act 1968.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order, which implements a recommendation of the Commission established under the International Convention for the North-West Atlantic Fisheries, prohibits the landing in the United Kingdom of red hake and silver hake caught in a specified area of the North-West Atlantic during the period 1st April 1973 to 30th April 1973. It excepts from the prohibition the landing of such hake caught whilst fishing for any other species of fish provided the hake do not exceed 10 per cent. of the total weight of the catch (or of that part of the catch) taken in the specified area.
