In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 254 of the Local Government Act 1972(a), I hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Local Government Act 1972 (Justices' Allowances) Order 1973 and shall come into operation on 1st April 1973.

2. Until 1st April 1974 subsection (5) of section 8 of the Justices of the Peace Act 1949(b), as amended by paragraph 3 of Schedule 27 to the Local Government Act 1972, shall have effect as if for the words from "shall be paid as follows" to the end of the subsection there were substituted the words "shall be paid by the county council or borough council, as the case may be".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

Paragraph 3 of Schedule 27 to the Local Government Act 1972, which comes into operation on 1st April 1973, substitutes a new subsection for subsection (5) of section 8 of the Justices of the Peace Act 1949. Under the substituted subsection the allowances payable to justices of the peace in respect of duties in the Crown Court are to be paid by the Lord Chancellor while allowances in respect of other duties of justices are to be paid by the council of the appropriate non-metropolitan county or metropolitan district, as the case may be. This Order makes transitional provision for the period until 1st April 1974 requiring the allowances which are not payable by the Lord Chancellor to be paid by the appropriate county or borough council.
