**The Trunk Road (Western Circus, Ealing) (Prescribed Route)
Order 1973**

<i>Made</i>	- - -	<i>26th March 1973</i>
<i>Coming into Operation</i>		<i>30th May 1973</i>

The Secretary of State for the Environment in exercise of the powers conferred by section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967(a), as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968(b), and now vested in him(c), and of all other enabling powers, and after consulting the Secretary of State for the Home Department, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Trunk Road (Western Circus, Ealing) (Prescribed Route) Order 1973 and shall come into operation on 30th May 1973.

2.—(1) The Interpretation Act 1889(d) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(2) In this Order:—

“Western Avenue” means that length of the London—Fishguard Trunk Road (A40) in the London Borough of Ealing known as Western Avenue;

“Western Circus” means such part of the carriageway of the said Trunk Road situated at the junction of Western Avenue with Old Oak Common Lane, Westway and Old Oak Road as lies within the London Borough of Ealing; and

“the south-western refuge” means the triangular island site at the junction of Western Circus with Western Avenue and that length of Old Oak Common Lane which lies to the south of Western Circus.

3. No person shall cause any vehicle entering Western Circus from that part of the carriageway of Old Oak Common Lane which lies to the east of the eastern edge of the south-western refuge to turn left into Western Avenue.

4. Nothing in this Order shall apply to anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden.
