COUNTER-INFLATION

The Counter-Inflation (Modification of the Remuneration of Teachers Act 1965) Order 1973

The Secretary of State in exercise of the powers conferred on her by section 8(1) of, and paragraph 1(1) and (2) of Schedule 2 to, the Counter-Inflation Act 1973(a) ("the 1973 Act"), hereby makes the following Order:—

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Counter-Inflation (Modification of the Remuneration of Teachers Act 1965) Order 1973 and shall come into operation on 1st April 1973.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Modification of the Remuneration of Teachers Act 1965

2.—(1) So long as Part II of the 1973 Act is in force the Remuneration of Teachers Act 1965(c) ("the 1965 Act") shall have effect subject to the modifications specified in this Article.

(2) The requirement imposed by sections 2(2) (review of remuneration by committees) and 4(1) (action on recommendations of arbitrators) of the 1965 Act to transmit recommendations to the Secretary of State shall include a requirement to transmit to the Pay Board established under section 1(1) of the 1973 Act ("the Board") any proposals contained in those recommendations for increases in the remuneration of teachers.

(3) Where any proposals are transmitted to the Board in accordance with paragraph (2) above, the references to recommendations transmitted to the Secretary of State contained in subsections (3) to (6) of section 2 of the 1965 Act shall in their application to those proposals be construed for the purposes of that Act as recommendations to make only such increases (if any) in remuneration as are approved by the Board.

Approval of proposals for remuneration of teachers

3.—(1) The Board shall entertain any proposals for increases in the remuneration of teachers contained in recommendations transmitted to them by virtue of Article 2 above.

(2) Where the Board are satisfied that the increases proposed in any recommendations transmitted to them under this Order ought to be allowed they shall approve the proposals.

(3) The Board shall give their decision whether or not to approve the proposals submitted to them by virtue of this Order within eight weeks of the date upon which they receive the proposals.

(4) Where the Board have not given their decision whether or not to approve the proposals within the time prescribed by paragraph (3) above they shall be deemed to have given their approval for the purposes of paragraph 2(1) of Schedule 2 to the 1973 Act.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order modifies the Remuneration of Teachers Act 1965 for so long as Part II of the Counter-Inflation Act 1973 is in force. The Remuneration of Teachers Act 1965 requires the Secretary of State to give effect to recommendations for the remuneration of teachers made by a committee established under that Act or, in default of agreement in the committee, by arbitrators. The Order provides for any recommendation involving increases in remuneration to be referred to the Pay Board and requires the Secretary of State to give effect only to such recommendations as are approved by the Board.
