**The Thames Water Authority (Bisham Brook and
Temple Ditch Discharge) Order 1974**

Made - - - 10th June 1974

Coming into Operation 25th June 1974

The Secretary of State for the Environment, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 1 of the Water Resources Act 1971(a) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. This order may be cited as the Thames Water Authority (Bisham Brook and Temple Ditch Discharge) Order 1974, and shall come into operation on 25th June 1974.

Citation and commencement.

2.—(1) In this order “the Authority” means the Thames Water Authority.

Interpretation.

(2) In this order:—

(a) a group of two letters and eight figures identifying a point represents the map co-ordinates of that point estimated to the nearest ten metres on the grid of the national reference system used by the Ordnance Survey on its maps and plans; and

(b) any such group of letters and figures is referred to as a reference point.

(3) The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply for the interpretation of this order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. The Authority are hereby authorised to discharge water by the means mentioned and at the points identified by a reference point specified in column (1) of the following table, into the watercourse specified opposite such reference point in column (2) of the table, at a rate not exceeding the rate specified opposite thereto in column (3) of the table.
