The Agricultural Lime Scheme (Extension of Period)

Order 1974

Laid before Parliament in draft

Made - - - 29th July 1974

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, the Secretary of State for Scotland and the Secretary of State for Northern Ireland (being the Secretaries of State respectively concerned with agriculture in Scotland and in Northern Ireland) in exercise of the powers vested in them by section 2 of the Agriculture (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1954(a) and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, with the approval of the Treasury, hereby make the following order.

Citation and interpretation

1.—(1) This order may be cited as the Agricultural Lime Scheme (Extension of Period) Order 1974.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply to the interpretation of this order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Extension of period for contributions

2. The period during which any cost must have been incurred in order that contributions may be payable in respect of it under section 1 of the Agriculture Act 1937(c), as amended by section 97 of the Agriculture Act 1947(d), is hereby further extended until the end of July 1979.

EXPLANATORY NOTE
(*This Note is not part of the order.*)

Contributions towards the cost of acquiring and transporting lime for use on agricultural land and spreading it on such land are payable in accordance with a scheme made under the Agriculture Act 1937, as amended by the Agriculture Act 1947. The prescribed period during which such contributions may be made is due to expire on the 31st July 1974, having previously been extended by five years respectively by the Agricultural Lime Scheme (Extension of Period) Order 1964 and by the Agricultural Lime Scheme (Extension of Period) Order 1969.

This order extends by a further five years, ending on the 31st July 1979, the period during which contributions may be made.
