**The Baking and Sausage Making (Christmas and New Year)
Order 1974***Made* - - - 2nd October 1974*Coming into Operation* 4th November 1974

The Secretary of State, having received an application in that behalf and having carried out such consultations as appeared to him to be appropriate, in exercise of powers conferred by section 117 of the Factories Act 1961(a) and now vested in him (b) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following special exemption order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Baking and Sausage Making (Christmas and New Year) Order 1974 and shall come into operation on 4th November 1974.

2.—(1) The Interpretation Act 1889(c) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(2) In this Order “women” means women who have attained the age of eighteen.

3. The employment of women in England and Wales—

(a) on Saturdays, 7th, 14th, 21st and 28th December 1974, and on Sundays, 8th, 15th, 22nd and 29th December 1974, in the manufacture of meat pies, sausages or cooked meats, or in the pre-packing of bacon; and

(b) on Saturdays, 14th, 21st and 28th December 1974, and on Sundays, 15th, 22nd and 29th December 1974, in the manufacture of bread or flour confectionery (including fruit pies but not biscuits),

or in work incidental or ancillary to such work, is hereby exempted from the provisions of section 86(b) of the Factories Act 1961 (so far as that paragraph prohibits the employment of women after one o'clock in the afternoon on Saturday) and from the provisions of section 93 of that Act (which relates to the prohibition of Sunday employment).

4. The employment of women in Scotland—

(a) on Saturdays, 14th, 21st and 28th December 1974 and 4th January 1975, and on Sundays, 15th, 22nd and 29th December 1974 and 5th January 1975, in the manufacture of meat pies, sausages or cooked meats, or in the pre-packing of bacon; and

(b) on Sundays, 15th, 22nd and 29th December 1974, in the manufacture of bread or flour confectionery (including fruit pies but not biscuits),

or in work incidental or ancillary to such work, is hereby exempted from the provisions of the said section 86(b) (so far as that paragraph prohibits the employment of women after one o'clock in the afternoon on Saturday) and from the provisions of the said section 93.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order enables women who have attained the age of eighteen to be employed on specified Saturday afternoons and Sundays in December 1974 and January 1975 in the manufacture of meat pies, sausages or cooked meats, or in the pre-packing of bacon, and in the manufacture of bread or flour confectionery (including fruit pies but not biscuits), or in work incidental or ancillary to such work.
