# The Probation (Allowances) (Amendment) (No. 3) **Rules 1974**

Made -24th November 1974 Laid before Parliament 3rd December 1974 9th December 1974 Coming into Operation

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Schedule 3 to the Powers of Criminal Courts Act 1973(a), I hereby make the following Rules:-

- 1. These Rules may be cited as the Probation (Allowances) (Amendment) (No. 3) Rules 1974 and shall come into operation on 9th December 1974.
- 2. These Rules replace the Probation (Allowances) (Amendment) (No. 2) Rules 1974(b) which are hereby revoked.
- 3. In Rule 5 of the Probation (Allowances) Rules 1971(c), as amended (d), for the words "£2.75" and "£5.50" there shall be substituted the words "£3.35" and "£6.70" respectively.

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This Note is not part of the Rules.)

These Rules increase the maximum rates of financial loss allowances payable to members of probation and after-care committees, case committees and community service committees. The new rates are £6.70, if the time involved exceeds 4 hours in a 24 hour period, and £3.35 in other cases. The Probation (Allowances) (Amendment) (No. 2) Rules 1974, which are revoked by Rule 2, were identical in substance to these Rules but were by inadvertence not laid before Parliament.
