CUSTOMS AND EXCISE

The Hydrocarbon Oil (Amendment) Regulations 1974

The Commissioners of Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by section 21 of the Hydrocarbon Oil (Customs & Excise) Act 1971(a) and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following Regulations:—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Hydrocarbon Oil (Amendment) Regulations 1974 and shall come into force on 29th March 1974.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply for the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. The Hydrocarbon Oil Regulations 1973(c) shall be amended by substituting for the figure “6” in Regulation 19 the figure “4”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations reduce from 6 lb to 4 lb the minimum amount of one of the chemical markers (furfuraldehyde) required, as a condition of obtaining rebate of hydrocarbon oil duty, to be added to every 100,000 gallons of gas oil or kerosene which is to be used otherwise than as road fuel and to every 100,000 gallons of light oil which is to be used as furnace fuel.
