In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section 254 of the Local Government Act 1972(a), I hereby make the following Order:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the London Borough Councillors Order 1974.

(2) This Order shall come into operation on 1st May 1974.

2. The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. A London borough councillor in office on 1st May 1974 shall, unless he resigns his office or it otherwise becomes vacant, continue in office until the fourth day after the day of election on which his successor is elected.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

The provisions of the London Government Act 1963 (c.33) governing the retirement from office of London borough councillors who are at present in office were repealed by the Local Government Act 1972. This Order provides that they will continue in office until their successors come into office after the forthcoming elections.
