The National Insurance and Industrial Injuries (Northern Ireland Reciprocal Arrangements) (Revocation) Regulations 1974

The Secretary of State for Social Services (a), in conjunction with the Treasury so far as relates to matters with regard to which the Treasury have so directed (b), in exercise of powers conferred by section 104(4)(b) of the National Insurance Act 1965(c), section 83(4)(b) of the National Insurance (Industrial Injuries) Act 1965(d) and section 6(2) of the National Insurance Act 1974(e) and of all other powers enabling her in that behalf, in order to give effect to arrangements made, with the consent of the Treasury, with the appropriate Northern Irish authority for co-ordinating the systems of insurance established respectively by the said Acts of 1965 and by corresponding Northern Irish legislation, hereby makes the following regulations:—

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) These regulations, which may be cited as the National Insurance and Industrial Injuries (Northern Ireland Reciprocal Arrangements) (Revocation) Regulations 1974, shall come into operation on 13th June 1974.

(2) The rules for the construction of Acts of Parliament contained in the Interpretation Act 1889(f) shall apply to this instrument and the revocations effected by it as they would apply if this instrument and the instruments containing the provisions which it revokes were Acts of Parliament and each revocation were a repeal.

(3) In these regulations—

(a) “the 1948 regulations” means the National Insurance (Northern Ireland Reciprocal Arrangements) Regulations 1948(g) and the National Insurance (Industrial Injuries) (Northern Ireland Reciprocal Arrangements) Regulations 1948(h); and

(b) “the Minister” means the Minister of National Insurance, the Minister of Pensions and National Insurance, the Minister of Social Security or, in relation to an instrument made after 31st October 1968, the Secretary of State.

Revocation of regulations

2. In the 1948 regulations the respective regulations 4 and Schedules 3 (by

which the Joint Authorities for national insurance (a) and industrial injuries (b) purposes were substituted for the Minister in relation to the making of the regulations specified in those Schedules) are hereby revoked.

Consequential provision

3. A provision contained in any instrument which (wholly or in part)—
- (a) was made or purports to be made by either of the said Joint Authorities by virtue of any provisions revoked by these regulations, or
 - (b) fell to be so made but in fact was made or purports to be made by the Minister,

shall—

- (i) if it has been revoked expressly or by implication, be deemed always until it was so revoked to have had effect, or
- (ii) if it has not been so revoked, be deemed always to have had and continue until it is so revoked to have effect,

by virtue of these regulations.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations revoke those provisions of the National Insurance (Northern Ireland Reciprocal Arrangements) Regulations 1948 and the National Insurance (Industrial Injuries) (Northern Ireland Reciprocal Arrangements) Regulations 1948 by which functions in relation to the making of regulations were conferred upon the National Insurance Joint Authority and the Industrial Injuries Joint Authority. They include provision for securing the past and continuing validity of regulations made in the name of the Joint Authorities and of regulations to which those provisions applied which were made by Ministers.

The Regulations give effect to reciprocal arrangements made with the Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland by which the co-ordination of the national insurance and industrial injuries systems of Great Britain and of Northern Ireland is to be secured by inter-departmental consultation which will cover a wider field than the former arrangements for the making of regulations by the Joint Authorities.
