**The Hair, Bass and Fibre Wages Council (Great Britain)
(Abolition) Order 1974**

WHEREAS the Secretary of State in accordance with section 4 of, and Schedule 1 to, the Wages Councils Act 1959(a) published notice of his intention to make an order abolishing the Hair, Bass and Fibre Wages Council (Great Britain):

AND WHEREAS no objection has been made with respect to the draft order referred to in the said notice:

NOW, therefore, the Secretary of State in exercise of powers conferred by section 4(1)(b) of, and paragraph 4 of Schedule 1 to, the said Act and now vested in him (b) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. The Hair, Bass and Fibre Wages Council (Great Britain) is hereby abolished.

2.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Hair, Bass and Fibre Wages Council (Great Britain) (Abolition) Order 1974 and shall come into operation on 21st June 1974.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(c) shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
