The Bread Prices (Amendment) Order 1975

<i>Made- - - -</i>	13th February 1975
<i>Laid before Parliament</i>	13th February 1975
<i>Coming into Operation</i>	18th February 1975

The Secretary of State, after consulting in accordance with subsection (6) of section 2 of the Prices Act 1974(a) with the organisations therein referred to, in exercise of her powers under subsections (1) and (8) of that section and of all other powers enabling her in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Bread Prices (Amendment) Order 1975 and shall come into operation on 18th February 1975.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament and as if this Order and the Order hereby varied were Acts of Parliament.

Maximum prices for bread loaves

2.—(1) The maximum price at which a person may sell a bread loaf in accordance with paragraphs (1) and (2) of article 3 of the Bread Prices Order 1974(c) (in this Order called the “principal order”)—

- (a) in Areas 1 to 4 referred to in the Table set out in the said paragraph (1) (which together comprise Great Britain), is increased, in relation to—
 - (i) categories 1 and 2, by 1½ pence; and
 - (ii) categories 3 and 4, by ½ penny;
- (b) in Area 5 referred to in that Table (which comprises Northern Ireland), is increased, in relation to—
 - (i) categories 1 and 2, by 2½ pence; and
 - (ii) categories 3 and 4, by 1 penny;
- (c) in Areas 1 to 5 referred to in that Table (which together comprise the whole of the United Kingdom), is increased, in relation to—
 - (i) categories 5 and 7(a), by 2 pence; and
 - (ii) categories 6, 7(b) and 8, by 1 penny.

(2) For the purposes of paragraph (b) in the definition of “special offer price” in article 1(3) of the principal order and of article 3(2)(b) of that Order, the price given by article 3(1)(a) of that Order shall be determined apart from the provisions of paragraph (1) above.

- (3) The price given by article 3(3) of the principal order is increased—
- (a) in the case of a Cholla loaf or of a bread loaf made of ritual bread, by 1 penny; and
 - (b) in the case of a bread loaf of a weight of not less than 42 oz, by 2 pence.

(4) Article 3 of the principal order is hereby varied, in paragraph (1)(b)(ii), by the substitution for the words “this Order” of the words “the Bread Prices (Amendment) Order 1975”.

3.—(1) Article 2 of the principal order is hereby varied, in paragraph (1), by the insertion after the words “that he has not” of the word “claimed”.

(2) Article 3 of the principal order is hereby varied, in the Table set out in paragraph (1), by the insertion in category 7 after the words “starch reduced bread” of the words “corn oil bread”.

Display of information

4. Article 5 of the principal order is hereby varied in paragraph (1), by the substitution for the words “Statutory Maximum Prices in this Shop” of the words “Statutory Maximum Prices”.

5. Article 5 of the principal order is hereby varied, in paragraph (3), by the addition at the end of the words “but subject in each case to the provisions of article 2 of the Bread Prices (Amendment) Order 1975”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order varies the Bread Prices Order 1974. The principal changes are increases in the maximum retail prices of bread subsidised under section 1 of the Prices Act 1974.

The Order also makes some consequential changes in the provisions of the Bread Prices Order 1974 relating to the display of information about statutory maximum prices for bread. It also makes some changes of a drafting nature.
