"the deposited plan" means the plan numbered HA 7/2-SE 54, marked "The London-Canterbury-Dover Trunk Road (Star Hill Intersection) Order 1975", signed by authority of the Secretary of State and deposited at the Department of the Environment, St Christopher House, Southwark Street, London SE1 0TE, where it is open to inspection free of charge at all reasonable hours:

"the Trunk Road" means the London-Canterbury-Dover Trunk Road (A2).

3. This Order shall come into operation on 20th January 1976 and may be cited as the London-Canterbury-Dover Trunk Road (Star Hill Intersection) Order 1975.
