## WAGES COUNCILS

**The Wages Regulation (Milk Distributive) (Scotland)  
(Amendment) Order 1975***Made - - - - - 13th March 1975**Coming into Operation 14th April 1975*

Whereas the Secretary of State has received from the Milk Distributive Wages Council (Scotland) the wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule hereto;

Now, therefore, the Secretary of State in exercise of powers conferred by section 11 of the Wages Councils Act 1959(a), and now vested in him (b), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Wages Regulation (Milk Distributive) (Scotland) (Amendment) Order 1975.

2.—(1) In this Order the expression “the specified date” means the 14th April 1975, provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression “the specified date” means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(c) shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. The wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule hereto shall have effect as from the specified date.

## Article 3

## SCHEDULE

## STATUTORY MINIMUM REMUNERATION

The Wages Regulation (Milk Distributive) (Scotland) Order 1974(a) (Order M.D.S. (105)), shall have effect as if in the Schedule thereto for paragraphs 2, 3 and 4 there were substituted the following paragraphs:—

## “COST OF LIVING PAYMENT

2.—(1) *In addition to the minimum remuneration specified in paragraph 1 of this Schedule, additional remuneration hereinafter referred to as a ‘cost of living payment’ shall be payable to all workers in accordance with this paragraph.*

(2) *The cost of living payment payable in respect of each complete pay week shall be—*

(i) *£2·80 in the case of full-time workers,*

(ii) *7p multiplied by the number of hours worked in that week (excluding overtime) in the case of part-time workers.*

(3) *The cost of living payment shall not be treated as part of the general minimum time rate for the purpose of calculating payment for overtime under paragraph 7 of this Schedule.*

Provided that—

- (1) an additional payment of £1 per week shall be payable to a tanker driver for technical work in measuring and sampling milk at farms;
- (2) a subsistence allowance of 15p per day shall be payable to such a tanker driver who is required to work more than 60 miles from his depot."

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of the Order.)*

This Order, which has effect from 14th April 1975, amends the Wages Regulation (Milk Distributive) (Scotland) Order 1974 (Order M.D.S. (105)) by consolidating the existing cost of living payment in the statutory minimum remuneration payable to workers in relation to whom the Milk Distributive Wages Council (Scotland) operates.

The Order also provides for a revised cost of living payment.

New provisions are printed in italics.
