NEW FOREST

The New Forest (Confirmation of Byelaw) Order 1976

Made

29th November 1976

Coming into Operation

1st January 1977

Whereas the byelaw set out in the Schedule hereto has been made by the Verderers of the New Forest in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 25 of the New Forest Act 1877(a), as extended by section 9 of the New Forest Act 1949(b), and upwards of one month before the date of this Order notice of intention to apply for confirmation of that byelaw has been given by the Verderers in the manner prescribed by the first mentioned section:

Now, therefore, the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by Section 9 of the New Forest Act 1949, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

- 1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the New Forest (Confirmation of Byelaw) Order 1976 and shall come into operation on 1st January 1977.
- (2) The New Forest (Confirmation of Byelaws) Orders 1954 to 1974(c), and this Order may be cited together as the New Forest (Confirmation of Byelaws) Orders 1954 to 1976.
- 2. The byelaw set out in the Schedule hereto and made by the Verderers of the New Forest in exercise of their hereinbefore recited powers is hereby confirmed.

SCHEDULE

The byelaws confirmed by the New Forest (Confirmation of Byelaws) Orders 1954 to 1974 shall be amended by substituting for byelaw 16 thereof the following byelaw:—

- "16. The payment specified in the first item in paragraph 2(a) of the First Schedule to the New Forest Act 1877, shall be varied so that, in lieu of the maximum payment there specified, the maximum payment which the Verderers may levy for marking every head of cattle entitled to be in the Forest shall be:—
 - (a) Ten pounds in respect of cattle depastured by virtue of a right of common and cattle belonging to tenants of land vested in the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food which are depastured by virtue of a licence granted on behalf of that Minister:
 - (b) Twenty pounds in respect of other cattle.

In this byelaw 'cattle' includes horses, donkeys and mules.".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

By this Order the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food confirms a byelaw made by the Verderers of the New Forest and brings it into operation on 1st January 1977. The byelaw increases the maximum payments that the Verderers may levy in respect of the marking of cattle (including horses, donkeys and mules) depastured in the Forest.
