**The Brucellosis Compensation (Scotland)
Amendment Order 1976**

<i>Made</i> - - - -	23rd February 1976

In exercise of the powers conferred by sections 17(3), 19(7) and 85(1) of the Diseases of Animals Act 1950(a) and now vested in me (b), and as extended by Article 3(1) of the Diseases of Animals (Extension of Definitions) Order 1971(c), and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf and with the approval of the Treasury, I hereby make the following order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This order, which may be cited as the Brucellosis Compensation (Scotland) Amendment Order 1976, shall come into operation on 25th February 1976.

Interpretation

2.—(1) This order shall be construed as one with the Brucellosis Compensation (Scotland) Order 1972(d), hereinafter referred to as “the principal order”.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(e) applies for the interpretation of this order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Amendment of principal order

3. Article 3(2) of the principal order (which prescribes scales of compensation payable for bovine animals slaughtered on account of brucellosis) shall be amended by the substitution—

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order amends the Brucellosis Compensation (Scotland) Order 1972 by increasing the maximum limits of compensation which may be paid for cattle slaughtered by the Secretary of State either because they are affected with brucellosis or because they have reacted to a diagnostic test for the disease. The limit for such cattle comprised in an accredited herd is increased from £180 to £300 and the limit for such cattle comprised in other herds from £240 to £400. In respect of cattle slaughtered by the Secretary of State because they have been exposed to the infection of brucellosis, compensation remains payable at full market value.
