The Civil Aviation (Notices) (Second Amendment) Regulations 1976

<i>Made</i> - - - -	12th January 1976
<i>Laid before Parliament</i>	13th January 1976
<i>Coming into Operation</i>	15th January 1976

The Secretary of State in exercise of his powers under section 29(1) and (3) of the Civil Aviation Act 1971(a) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf hereby makes the following Regulations.

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Civil Aviation (Notices) (Second Amendment) Regulations 1976 and shall come into operation on 15th January 1976.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply for the purpose of the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. The Civil Aviation (Notices) Regulations 1971(c), as amended(d), shall be further amended as follows:—

In Regulation 2 for “Her Majesty’s Stationery Office” there shall be substituted “the Civil Aviation Authority”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations, which come into operation on 15th January 1976, further amend the Civil Aviation (Notices) Regulations 1971 by providing that the manner of publishing notices under section 29(1) and (3) of the Civil Aviation Act 1971 shall be by setting forth the notices in a document published by the Civil Aviation Authority instead of by Her Majesty’s Stationery Office.
