# The London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road (Dalmagarry to Bogbain) Order 1976

Made -

8th April 1976

Coming into Operation

30th April 1976

The Secretary of State in exercise of the powers conferred on him by sections 1(2) and 2(3) (as substituted by section 133(1) of and Schedule 14 paragraph 41 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973(a)) of the Trunk Roads Act 1946(b) as read with the Transfer of Functions (Roads, Bridges and Ferries) Order 1955(c) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf and having complied with the provisions of Schedule 2 to the said Act of 1946 as amended by section 51 of and Schedule 1 to the Roads (Scotland) Act 1970(d) hereby makes the following order:-

- 1. This order may be cited as The London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road (Dalmagarry to Bogbain) Order 1976 and shall come into operation on 30th April 1976.
- 2. The Interpretation Act 1889(e) shall apply for the interpretation of this order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 3. The lengths of road (hereinafter referred to as "the new roads") which the Secretary of State proposes to construct along the routes described in Schedule 1 to this order, shall become trunk road on the date of the coming into operation of this order.
- 4. On 1st April next after the date on which notice is given by the Secretary of State to the Regional Council for the Highland Region that the new roads are opened for the purposes of through traffic, those lengths of the London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road described in Schedule 2 to this order (hereinafter referred to as "the old roads") shall cease to be trunk roads and the Regional Council shall become the highway authority therefor.

#### SCHEDULE 1

#### THE ROUTES OF THE NEW ROADS

- 1. From a point on the existing London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road (A9) in the District of Inverness 140 metres or thereby west of Dalmagarry Bridge in a westerly then northerly direction for a distance of 10.75 kilometres or thereby to a point on the said existing trunk road 20 metres or thereby north of Daviot Bridge, the centre line of the new road being indicated by a heavy black line between the points marked "A" and "B" on the plan numbered RUP/21/1/1 and marked "The London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road (Dalmagarry to Bogbain) Order 1976", signed and sealed with reference to this order and deposited at the office of the Scottish Development Department, New St. Andrew's House, Edinburgh. A certified copy of the said plan has been deposited at the office of the Regional Council for the Highland Region, County Buildings, Ardross Street, Inverness.
- 2. From a point on the said existing trunk road 250 metres or thereby south of Daviot Church in a northwesterly direction for a distance of 1.7 kilometres or thereby to a point on the said existing trunk road 250 metres or thereby south of its junction with the Nairnside Road the centre line of the new road being indicated by a heavy black line between the points marked "C" and "D" on the said plan.

### SCHEDULE 2

#### THE OLD ROADS

- 1. That length of the said existing trunk road from a point 140 metres or thereby west of Dalmagarry Bridge in a westerly and then northwesterly direction for a distance of 10.62 kilometres or thereby to a point 20 metres or thereby north of Daviot Bridge as shown by black and white hatching between the points marked "A" and "B" on the said plan.
- 2. That length of the said existing trunk road from a point 250 metres or thereby south of Daviot Church in a generally northwesterly direction for a distance of 1.7 kilometres or thereby to a point 250 metres or thereby south of its junction with the Nairnside Road as shown by black and white hatching between the points marked "C" and "D" on the said plan.
